Dear Friends,

Thinking about Rosh Hashanah, I am struck how it is one of the most passive observances in Jewish tradition. It is a mitzvah to *hear* the shofar. All we have to do is show up and listen. (In a sense Yom Kippur is even more passive—we don't even get up to eat!) But that sound of the shofar calls us to true action. Preparing for the high holidays is not like preparing for Passover, when we must clean and shop to no apparent end. In these days of preparation we are taught not to think of unrisen bread but of needy relationships. Whom have we wronged that we might make amends? Or even more challenging, how can we bridge the distance between us and those who have caused us pain?

I have been watching for quite some time the construction of what will be known as the Governor Mario M. Cuomo Bridge, replacing the old Tappan Zee Bridge. Besides the fact that Governor Cuomo (the first) was one of my heroes growing up in New York State, I have been awed now by the engineering accomplishment of such magnitude, built with such determination and vision over several years. We would always wonder why the widest spot in the Hudson was picked for a bridge. Tappan "Zee" is Dutch for the Tappan Sea, as the river looks like a large lake at that point, so wide (three miles across) that you cannot even see the river flowing in and out. Maybe it is shallower there, or maybe that's just where the Thruway is which was where the Native Americans always crossed, but for whatever reason, the distance is great. Often, in our lives, the distance that separates us from others seems impossibly wide and unbridgeable. Yet with commitment and willingness, any distance can be crossed. The sound of the shofar is a call to bridge that divide. Yes, on Rosh Hashanah we need only show up and listen. But to do so we must first get from here to there.

I am honored and blessed to share the welcoming of the new year with you for the ninth time together. As we continue to grow and learn from each other, I know you join me in celebrating the Temple Israel and Jewish Community Center family. Alla, Laurence and Ariel join me in wishing you and yours a shanah tovah umetukah, a sweet and good new year!

We have all heard the expression that the only thing constant in life is change. As I am writing this during the last week of June, the expression certainly holds true for RCBI right now.





Dear Temple Israel Member:

Re: Temple Israel's High Holy Day Seating Policies

The Ritual Committee is now accepting requests for High Holy Day seats. The seating will be handled with a three-tier seating plan (reserved pew, reserved non-pew, open seats). The reserved non-pew seating is limited to 48 seats in a section immediately behind the pews.

Each member family will be allocated 2 basic seats (1 in the case of a single member). Children who are post bar/bat mitzvah through age 22 will also be given a basic seat. Non members will be granted seats if they are members in good standing of another synagogue and provide a letter from the synagogue indicating the same.

Seating definitions and fees:

BASIC SEAT (extended family)	"	\$85.00
NON-PEW RESERVED	Reserved non-pew section	\$50.00*
PEW RESERVED	Pews	\$80.00*

*Reserved non-pew and pew fees are **IN ADDITION** to extended family basic fees.

SECURITY ALERT

As a security measure we will require **every** individual to present a ticket when entering the synagogue. It is imperative that seating request forms be completed correctly with the complete name of every individual for whom a ticket is requested. **Admittance will be denied to anyone who is unable to present a ticket at the entrance.** We regret that we must take this action. Security personnel will be at the entrance and they will not have any knowledge of your affiliation to the synagogue.

Attached is a seating chart showing the configuration of our sanctuary. The various sections are indicated on the chart. When completing your reservation form please indicate, in order of preference, which areas you prefer. We will make every effort to accommodate seating requests. The form must be completed in full and must be legible. **NO PHONE CALLS WILL BE MADE FOR CLARIFICATION.**

Payment must accompany your seating request.


As we have for the past few years, we once again urge each congregant, from the youngest to this oldest, to bring to the *Kol Nidre* service on **Friday, September 29 at 6:00 pm**, food, personal care items, and clothing, for distribution to the hungry and homeless.

The number of people, including families with children, who need assistance in our local and extended communities continues to rise dramatically. In addition, natural disasters increase the ranks of the needy nationwide.

Food items needed most are: pancake mix, syrup, rice products, coffee, juices, par-malot, condiments (ketchup, mayo, salad dressing), snack items for kids (cookies, healthy snacks), cake or brownie mix, canned fruit, jarred spaghetti sauce, apple sauce, macaroni and cheese, olive, canola, or corn oil, beans, any type, canned soups, canned tomato products (sauce, diced, etc), dish washing liquid, facial tissues, paper towels, shampoo, body wash, toothpaste, shaving cream, disposable razors, laundry detergent, household cleaning supplies

Our families cannot use the food voucher to purchase anything other than food. No glass containers, please; and most important: no outdated or dented cans/packages; give only what you would eat/drink yourself.

Temple Israel & JCC Security Procedures for High Holy Days 5778 - 2017

In an effort to make the upcoming High Holy Days safe and enjoyable for all, we wish to provide everyone with a list of the security procedures that will be in place this year. Most of the policies enacted in previous years remain in place. Please take the time to read the information carefully. The more you know about the security regulations prior to your arrival at the synagogue, the more enjoyable the experience will be.

1- Tickets:

Synagogue members above the age of our Religious School students, guests, and working staff members will be required to present a ticket bearing their name as they enter the building. Entry will be restricted to the two Main Entrance doors. All traffic entering and leaving the building will be restricted to these doors, except at the end of services on Rosh Hashanah Day 1 and Rosh Hashanah Day 2, when (weather permitting) the glass Sanctuary doors will be opened to access the Kiddush out on the front lawn.

2- Entrance Procedures:

There will be one distinct entrance lane after walking through the double doors at the synagogue's main entrance. Tickets will be inspected by a synagogue usher who will be present to greet you. Then, a uniformed security person will inspect any type of bag or package being carried into the *shul*. This includes *tallit* bags, diaper bags, backpacks and handbags. The owner will be requested to open his/her bag for a brief, visual inspection. Property will only be removed for just cause. We urge full cooperation with the security person in charge of this procedure. We ask attendees to leave all unnecessary bags in their automobiles. Strollers and baby carriages will not be allowed in the sanctuary due to fire department regulations. All strollers and carriages must be left in the coatroom after undergoing inspection.

3- Ushers:

Ushers will support the presence of the security personnel. **Anyone arriving without a ticket will have to have an ID that will be cross-checked with the names listed on the synagogue's ticket roster at the main entrance.** Ushers will not allow anyone to leave the building through any door other than the main entrance doors, and all secondary doors will be secured except for emergency use. Since an opened door compromises security, adult synagogue members must explain this security procedure to their children and/or guests.

4- Parking Permits:

Each family will be issued a Temple Israel parking permit. **The permit will be enclosed with your High Holy Day seating tickets.** The permit must be placed on the dashboard of any vehicle parked in the synagogue parking lot. Please indicate the number of parking permits on your high holiday seating request form **NO LATER THAN Friday, August 25, 2017.** If you have not marked your form, one permit will be mailed with your tickets.

Temple Israel & JCC Security Procedures for High Holy Days 5778 - 2017

Putting the request in writing will help eliminate potential communication problems. The additional permits will be included in the same mailing. **Cars arriving without parking permits will not be allowed to use the synagogue parking lot. Please understand that these permits do not guarantee a parking spot, and we always reach overflow conditions during the holidays.** We ask your assistance in making an effort to minimize the number of vehicles each family brings to services.

We urge everyone to obey all the other parking rules. Parking is permitted in designated spaces only, with handicap spots reserved for those with permits. **Do not park in the driveway.** The Fire Department requires that both the entrance and exit lanes provide a clear path for emergency vehicles.

5- What High Holy Day Service Attendees Should Expect:

- a- A police patrol car will be parked in front of the Synagogue during all services.
- b- Plain clothed security staff will be in our building throughout the High Holy Day services including the community services.
- c- **Anticipate minor delays** when entering the building for ticket and package inspection; please allow extra time to get to your seats.

In advance, we appreciate your understanding and cooperation with our High Holy Day security procedures, as we aim to create a safe environment for all attendees. We are all charged with being aware of our surroundings. Be observant and attentive to possible problems. Please do not hesitate to point out anything that doesn't look right to the nearest usher or security person.


